



Fejér Zoltán

Born in 1939, in Zirc Hungary.

Zoltán Fejér came to Sopron as a teacher in 1961. Parallely to his active teaching activity (general and secondary school teaching) his art was developing. He has been a regular exhibitor since 1971. His work has been among others dignified by Kratochwill Mimi, Nándor Salamon, dr. Gábor Pogány art historians and Tibor Tüskés Attila József Prize-winning writer. He is a founding member and vice-president of the Sopron Fine Arts Society, a member of the Association of Hungarian Drawing Festivals.

The decisive periods of his art work:

Until 1971 free watercolors

1971-1981 icon-emblematic and symbolic panel-like, laser light structures

1981-1991 rhombus landscape miniatures, reality-etude graphics, figurative board paintings

From 1991 Sopron city paintings, Sopron object culture, "ponzichter" world processing

Since 2001 Sopron still life allegories

From 2003 "polished" still-life

From 2007 he has been a plain air gouache pastor of Lake Fertő landscape, figurative, mythological and

reality scenes.

From 2009 the reed anthropomorphic.

He is also actively and continuously dealing with the research of visual systems, especially with regard to the role of light structures on surfaces. In 1975 he painted laser-light valeurs. Linking and displaying the folk material culture, such as the landscape and material world of the Upper Rábaköz, and appear on his landscape miniatures, covers about ten years in his art work. His art expresses the similar content culture of Sopron and the Lake Fertő landscape, paying special attention to the processing of the poncichters' traditions. His creations are accompanied by the passage of time, the pathetic beauty of our world, and the prominent role of humanity and the coexistence with the landscape, in which the allegories of their fate have been sent. He is regularly dealing with visuality and art research. He also illustrates brochures.
